

WELCOME TO THE MEXTLEVEL

Endoscopy is pivotal for gastrointestinal (GI) disease diagnosis, and about two million people undergo GI endoscopic procedures every year in Italy. Moreover, therapeutic endoscopy is constantly evolving, with the rapid development of new and progressively more complex techniques. High quality endoscopy is essential to achieve better health outcomes and to improve patient experience. Accordingly, in 2015 the European Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (ESGE) recognized quality of GI endoscopy as a major priority.

It is well known that continuous performance measurement is an effective method to improve quality. This promoted ESGE and other scientific societies to develop a series of objective performance indicators for upper GI, lower GI, pancreaticobiliary and small bowel endoscopy, and for the overall endoscopy unit management. Evidence-based performance measures can provide both endoscopists and endoscopy units with a framework and benchmark against which they can assess their own performance, and the formulation of individual minimum requirements and targets using these indicators promotes quality improvement. However, there is currently substantial variability in the quality of endoscopy performed by different units. The implementation of performance measures, along with structured training programs, can result in significant improvements in GI endoscopy quality.

The aim of our congress is to highlight and discuss the clinical significance of performance indicator measurement, in order to increasingly promote the culture of quality in GI endoscopy.


